The simple facts



Congenital heart disease is a leading cause of death of Australian habies

Eight babies are born with a heart condition in Australia every day. Almost 3,000 every year.

> Approximately half of the children diagnosed with heart disease require surgery to correct it.

Each week more than four Australians pass away as a result of congenital heart disease



HeartKids provides lifelong support for heart kids and their families.

It is estimated that 32.000 children (under 18 years of age) are currently living with congenital heart disease in Australia.

> Some children acquire heart disease - often as a result of rheumatic fever, which is prevalent communities.

HeartKids is the only organisation dedicated to supporting impacted families.

HeartKids is the voice for congenital heart disease in Australia, working with clinicians, community and government to improve quality of life for people with congenital heart disease, and their families.

HeartKids funds research to help understand congenital
